CREATIVE TEAM

VANESSA WALTERS is a Brooklyn-based choreographer, director, filmmaker, and performing artist making work since 2001. Her ongoing multimedia project *Ripening* has been featured at Lincoln Center, Tribeca Film Festival, Triskelion Arts, NADA Art Fair/Art Basel, Galapagos Art Space, FLICfest Dance Festival, and others.

Vanessa was the show choreographer for all three seasons of TruTV's "At Home with Amy Sedaris." She choreographed and performed in several films and videos with artist/director Marcel Dzama, most notably "Une Danse des Bouffons" and NYCB video installation at Lincoln Center (2016); and recently, "Trip to the Moon (For Lorca)". Throughout 2016 and 2017, Walters performed on tour with gypsy punk band Gogol Bordello.

From 2001 to 2012, Walters was lead choreographer/dancer for Fischerspooner, a performance group combining pop entertainment with high art, performing at London's Royal Festival Hall, Hammerstein Ballroom, NYC's Deitch Projects, MOCA LA, and the Pompidou Center, amongst others, with TV appearances on Top of the Pops, The Jimmy Kimmel Show, and The Carson Daly Show. The Fischerspooner production *Between Worlds* was created in collaboration with The Wooster Group and toured internationally.

Other choreography and performance credits include collaborations with Kate Mueth and the Neopolitical Cowgirls, Wendy Osserman, Sarah Small, Andrew Schneider, and Nicole Wolcott in addition to commercial work for MTV promo spots and national commercials.

BRIAN C. GONZALEZ is a Queer Chicano filmmaker, interdisciplinary artist, and educator working in a variety of mediums including video art, immersive installation, and performance, all under the artistic pseudonym TAXIPLASM.

His film and video work has shown in Times Square (Midnight Moment), Sundance Film Festival, Fotografiska Museum, Gasteig München, United Nations, Art Basel Miami Beach, NADA Art Fair, Dubai Design Week, Dance On Camera, The David Rubenstein Atrium at Lincoln Center, along with residencies for multimedia performance at The Robert Wilson Watermill Center, The Standard, and the Cosmopolitan of Las Vegas. He has most recently been awarded the QueerlArt Fellowship for Film developing his first narrative feature film, entitled "Where The Fire Follows".

He has taught internationally at Princeton University, The New School, Stanford University and more. Currently he is a professor in Storytelling and Narrative Arts at the School of Visual Arts in New York City and at the Berklee College of Music in Live Experience Design.

DAVID QUINN is a fashion and costume designer working in a variety of mediums from theatre, dance, and film to burlesque and red carpets. Quinn's theatre work has appeared in numerous traditional and non-traditional venues across America and internationally. In 2017 his work on *Jack* was described as "jaw dropping" (*Travelance*) and "glorious" (*Time Out NY*). In 2022 his costumes for *Dick Rivington* were hailed as "brilliantly inventive" by the *NY Times*. Quinn has designed dance costumes in collaboration with NYC based choreographers and soloists including The Martha Graham Company, Merce Cunningham, and Stanley Love. *Dance View Times* said, "Quinn is cutting and draping and colouring the most beautiful dance costumes to be found in New York."

Quinn's wide-ranging group of collaborators has recently included artists such as the iconic drag queen The Lady Bunny. Music legend Debbie Harry - creating her mirrored shroud for Coachella. Many red carpet and press event looks for Bridget Everett (HBO - *Somebody Somewhere*). Also, several incredible pieces for performance artist Darrel Thorne. Quinn's work has appeared in a variety of publications and has been immortalized in several books and films.

Recently, Quinn designed the costumes for the Heartbeat Opera's production of The Golden Cock. His designs will also be featured in the Panto production of The Sleeping Beauty at the Abrons Art Center opening December 2nd. Quinn is

After writing his first book *Disorientation Therapy* in 2007, **OMAR ZUBAIR** found that the closer to the core of being he looked, the more blurry it became; so, he began to listen to it, instead. And ever since, listening has become his primary compositional technique — whether creating a theatrical score with The Wooster Group or building a sound installation for a national historic landmark, whether sound designing for a blind choreographer so that she can continually orient toward the audience or improvising with a dance class at Julliard to coax authentic movement out of each student, whether making music to help people grieve at a funeral or celebrate at a wedding. He lets the ear hear twice before acting once. He has helped found composer collectives across multiple countries in order to promote radical empathy and empower active listening. Some places his work has been presented are Le Grand Palais & Le Centre Pompidou in Paris, The Guggenheim and Lincoln Center in New York, The Disney Concert Hall and Young Projects in Los Angeles, SESC Pompeia in Brazil, and DeSingel Art City in Belgium.

ALEX TAYLOR has worked as a lighting designer and lighting supervisor in New York and abroad since 2008. As lighting designer his recent projects include when the blossom passes, what remains? (Holdtight), Warriors (Johnny Butler), and Get Back! Summer Concert Series (St. Ann's Warehouse). Alex was the lighting supervisor for numerous productions including Monsoon Wedding, Oklahoma!, A 24-Decade History of Popular Music, Hamilton, Fun Home, and Shakespeare in The Park. Alex is currently the lighting designer for the Seawell Ballroom in Denver, Colorado. He is thrilled to be a part of this amazingly Wyld team!

Born 1976 in New York City and raised with the global immigrant community of Queens, **GEORGE DEL BARRIO** is the Founding Creative Director × Executive Producer of <u>The Vanderbilt Republic</u> (est. 2008) & <u>MIDHEAVEN Network + Studio</u> (est. 2020), as well as Creative Director × Executive Producer at <u>Universe City NYC</u> (2021-present) & <u>Space for Arts</u> (2023-).

As a 1st-generation American and all-media Creative/ Technical Director deeply versed in photographic physics, immersive curatorial design, and all phases of production, Del Barrio's practice is concentrated on archetype expansion. Every site response is architected by a resolute humanism; every invention, design, & transformation is in search of duende — meaning is not a discovery, it is a creation. Clients include The Keith Haring Foundation, Rutgers University, Textile Arts Center, MADERA, On The Revel, PALISSIMO Company, Cardistry-Con & the dawning sunlight of an awakened mind.

AVA HANDLEY, Ava's lifelong practice lies at the nexus of art and natural science. A forever student of her surroundings, she works in a variety of mediums and subjects that comfortably include concept art, comics, ecological advocacy, taxidermy, skeleton cleaning and science visibility. Her primary passions are exploring comparative anatomy, designing creatures, and the development of the study of natural history, guiding her to a BFA in Illustration at Rhode Island School of Design with a concentration in Nature, Culture and Sustainability Studies. She is happiest researching intensely obscure topics, cooking foraged goods and indulging in horror movies.

MAGGIE HEATH is a production designer and manager located in NYC. They received a BFA from Portland State University, focusing in sculpture; though found a creative home in theaters and with dancers. NICHOLAS PAPADAKIS is a Brooklyn-based artist and designer. He received a BFA from the Rhode Island School of Design where he pursued an interdisciplinary fine arts education (steeped in a family tradition of science, engineering, art restoration, and antique dealing). His artworks have been exhibited in galleries, museums, and site-specific locations internationally. Nicholas's primary passion is in the never-ending pursuit of experimental, process-oriented paintings. He has developed a unique painting style that exposes the fractal qualities of rare, powdered pigments - through which he explores the language of Earth's physical and organic properties - and expresses

the elegant, self-organizing principles of nature. His current artworks explore concepts of extinction, regeneration, and sustainability of the human experience.

Nicholas's skills as a multi-faceted arts professional have earned the attention of diverse commercial and collaborative interests as well, including: designer of experiential spaces, curator of art exhibitions & publications, designer of luxury products, commissions for national ad campaigns, graphic branding for startups, co-creator of in-house design studios, and user-interface consultant for Adobe After Effects.

Nicholas has been collaborating with Vanessa Walters on RIPENING since its inception: providing artwork, art direction, and prop sourcing for many of its incarnations.
